

Letter 35: 1519, Sélestat, Beatus Rhenanus to Capito

Printed in *Briefwechsel des Beatus Rhenanus*, ed. A. Horawitz and K. Hartfelder (Leipzig 1886; reprint 1966), p. 562.

[*Summary*]: If Capito is dissuading Zwingli from editing his *Dialogi*, Beatus does not want to take the blame. He does not object to the publication of the other books, which Capito has shown him, but they must not interfere with the printing of the Cyprian edition. He does not want to burden Froben with them since his schedule is already full. Beatus regrets that the edition of Cyprian is proceeding so slowly since Erasmus is expected to send some works shortly. He warns Capito not to betray the author of the *Ars et modus inquirendi et damnandi haereticos* (i.e. Crotus Rubeanus), a work which will be too caustic for the taste of the monks. Everyone will laugh if Erasmus' work were to appear with Capito's scholia (cf. above Ep. 9). Greetings to Caspar Hedio.
