

Letter 52: July 1520, [Ebernburg?], Ulrich von Hutten to Capito

Printed in *Ulrichi Hutteni equitis Germani opera*, ed. E. Böcking (Leipzig 1859-1861; reprint 1963), vol. I, pp. 363-365, #181.

[*Summary*]: Hutten again begs Capito for a copy of the papal letter to Albert of Brandenburg condemning Hutten's publication, and tells him to ask Tilman [Kreych] to help him. He asks whether Nikolaus Carbach has news from Frankfurt. Hutten's brother is at Franz von Sickingen's and will act as go-between. Hutten wants Capito to inform him of the reception of the German poem *Clag und vormanung*. He sends his regards to Johannes Brassicanus. Franz von Sickingen thinks that Charles V will support them.
