

Letter 78: 9 February 1521, [Speyer], Martin Bucer to Capito

Printed in *Correspondance de Martin Bucer*, ed. J. Rott (Leiden 1979-), vol. I, pp. 138-139, #25.

[*Summary*]: Bucer thanks Capito for his concern and good advice, but he did not have the time to write the apostolic notary, Johannes Corycius, before the departure of the courier for Rome. Meanwhile a friend of Maternus Hatten sent to Rome the request in writing and promises that within two months Bucer will receive the papal brief granting commission to Anton Engelbrecht to absolve him from his monastic vows. He regards Engelbrecht as his patron. Bucer sends his regards to Jakob Truchsess and the poet Thielemann Conradi Philhymnus.
