

Letter 86: 28 March 1521, Ebernburg, Martin Bucer to Capito

Printed in *Correspondance de Martin Bucer*, ed. J. Rott (Leiden 1979-), vol. I, pp. 142-144, #29.

[*Summary*]: Bucer is anxiously awaiting a response to the many letters he wrote about his desire to be absolved of his monastic vows. Franz von Sickingen informed him that Capito had promised to come to the Ebernburg during the Easter season. Bucer begs him to keep his promise so that they can discuss his situation. Ulrich von Hutten has time for religious matters [cf. *Correspondence de Martin Bucer*, vol. I, #6 suggesting that this is a reference to Hutten's plans to complete his invectives against the clergy]. Bucer requests Capito to respond by way of one of the servants of Schweickard von Sickingen and sends his regards to Caspar Hedio.
