

Letter 206: [End of July/Beginning of August 1524, Strasbourg], Martin Bucer to Capito

Printed in CorrBucer 1, pp. 262-263, Ep. 70.

[*Summary*]: Hedio should exhort the people to remain firm in their faith. [Thomas] Murner has set out to prove that the mass is a sacrifice. They will answer him when the tract appears. Murner does not want laymen to be involved in theological disputations. In responding to him, moderation is necessary, but it is not possible to keep silence. Bucer will invite Treger and Murner to another disputation. He wishes Capito a happy wedding night with his wife, Agnes Roettel.
