

Letter 252: 5 November 1525, Wittenberg, Martin Luther to Capito

Printed in WABr 3, 602-3, Ep. 941.

[*Summary*]: Luther is glad to hear the Strasbourgers' praise of Zwingli and Oecolampadius, whom they call "holy men." He makes no such claims for himself but does take credit for being the first to bring Christ to the people. He does not agree with Zwingli's pronouncements on original sin. It is possible that he himself is in error, but they are equally liable to error. Caselius will report his views in more detail [cf. Ep. 252a].
