

Letter 253: 5 November 1525, Wittenberg, Johann Bugenhagen to Capito

The text is quoted in full in BrOek 1, p. 424, note 2.

[*Summary*]: Bugenhagen supports peace among the reformers, but the Wittenbergers have taught only what can be found in scripture. He is offended by Capito's terms *esculentus Deus* ("edible God"), *impanatus Deus* ("God in bread"), and *carnivora* ("meat-eaters"), which he uses in the interpretation of the Eucharist. He bears Capito and his colleagues much good will, but cannot accept their "twisted" interpretation.
