

Letter 302: 18 August 1526, Strasbourg, Capito to Ulrich Zwingli

[*Summary*]: Capito reports that Zwingli's book against Johannes Fabri [i.e. *Die dritte geschrift Huldrych Zuinglins wider Joansen Faber, über das erdicht büchlin* ([Zurich], 1526)] is an effective response. He has sent two copies to Speyer: one to Philip of Hesse, the other to Jacob Sturm, both of whom know Fabri's worthlessness. In his book, Zwingli has been more successful than Capito in revealing Fabri's tricks. Capito hopes that people will now recognize Fabri's true nature. Many people have become suspicious of wicked men like Fabri. His reputation will no doubt suffer.
