

Letter 387: 28 April 1529, [Strasbourg], Capito to Ulrich Zwingli

[*Summary*]: The Strasbourgers have sent Jakob Otter to Solothurn on the request of [Caspar Schaller] the city scribe of Basel. He is a worthy man to join Simprecht Schenk in Memmingen [see above Ep. 386]. Capito refers cryptically to a fortunate occasion allowing them “to undo the chains and alliance concluded with impious men in bad faith.” A letter from Christian Fridbold, [representative of St. Gallen at the Diet of Speyer], will tell more about their hopes. Martin [Germanus] has accepted Zwingli’s teaching and will travel to Zurich to speak with him personally. Bucer sends his greetings.
