

Letter 391: 18 May 1529, Strasbourg, Capito to Ulrich Zwingli

Printed in ZwBr 4, pp. 124-26, Ep. 842.

[*Summary*]: Caspar Schwenckfeld, who breathes the spirit of Christ, has arrived in Strasbourg. He complains about Zwingli having published his tractate on the Eucharist [*Ein anwysunge, das die opinion der leylichen gegenwertighheit ... ist ... widder den ynnhalt der gantzen schrift*, written 1527, published Zurich: Froschauer 1529]. Capito uses coded language to allude to Fabri's machinations at the Diet of Speyer and his attempts to foster dissent among the reformers. Zwingli's letter [ZwBr 4, Ep. 839; the letter was sent via Strasbourg] will soon reach Philip of Hesse. Luther will be obliged to meet with Zwingli. Capito asks Zwingli to write to Schwenckfeld.
