

Letter 473: 21 April 1532, Strasbourg, Capito to Joachim Vadianus

Printed in VadBr 5:53–4, Ep. 680.

[*Summary*]: Capito asked Nikolaus Guldi why St Gallen accepted the harsh conditions of peace. He replied that they could not reject the demands of the abbot, [Diethelm Blaurer], after he proved his rights. They did not make concessions concerning scripture. Capito wishes he had visited St Gallen and spoken to the preachers when he was in the vicinity [see above, Ep. 466]. He has written to Dominik [Zili?] about the duty of the magistracy and the moderation necessary in reprehending others. He hopes he will take his advice in good stead. Capito asks Vadianus to reply to his guest, [Jakob] Ziegler. Bucer has gone to Schweinfurt with a delegation from the council. There is a rumour that a large Turkish army will invade Hungary.
