

Letter 601: 28 March [1536], Basel, Capito to Joachim Vadianus

[*Summary*]: Luther has asked for a meeting. He has not yet responded to a letter sent from Basel through [Johann Feige], the chancellor of [Philip of Hesse]. An agreement may be imminent, but the Elector [Johann Friedrich I of Saxony] may regard it as a matter to be deliberated by the princes and city magistrates. The polemic over the Eucharist seems to have become more moderate. There are a few troublesome people in Kraichgau, in the realm of the Count Palatine [Ludwig V]. The Strasbourgers have written about this to Philip [of Hesse]. Capito has heard of the death of [Wolfgang Wetter alias Jufli] and the need for a minister to replace him at [St Gallen]. Capito mentions the teacher Sebastian Kunz in positive terms, but recommends [Johann Valentin] Furtmüller for the position of pastor.
